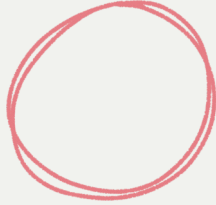


The Lord Is My Shepherd

He guides me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

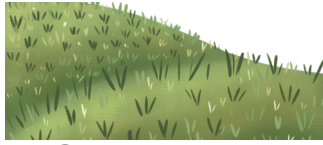
⁴ Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,

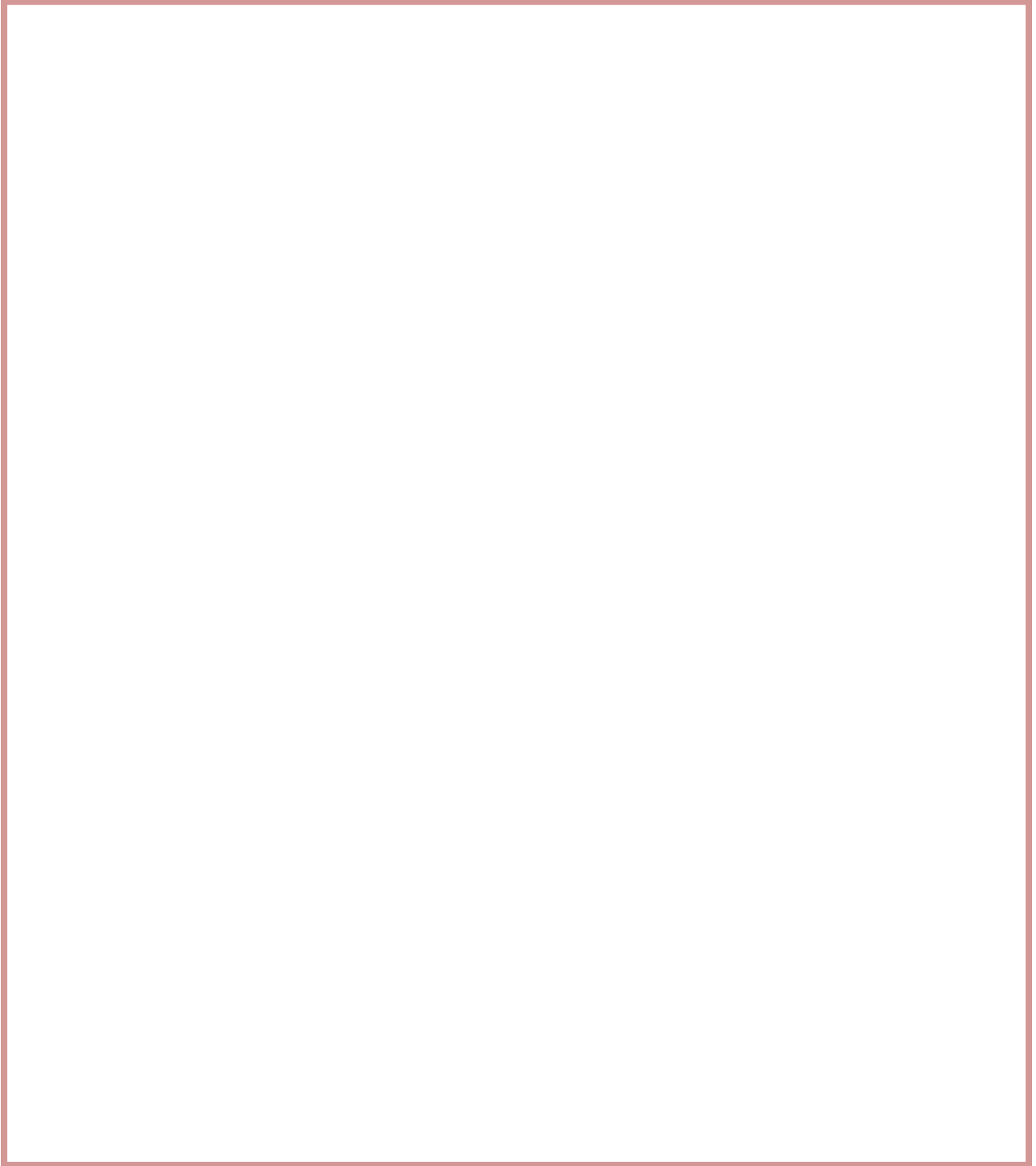
